Glendale Adventist Medical Center's \$110,000 Golf Fundraiser

The 24th annual Glendale Adventist Medical Center Golf Classic, which took place at the Oakmont Country Club on Oct. 1, netted more than \$110,000. Proceeds will provide state-of-the-art equipment in the hospital's new West Tower, which opened Sept. 18.

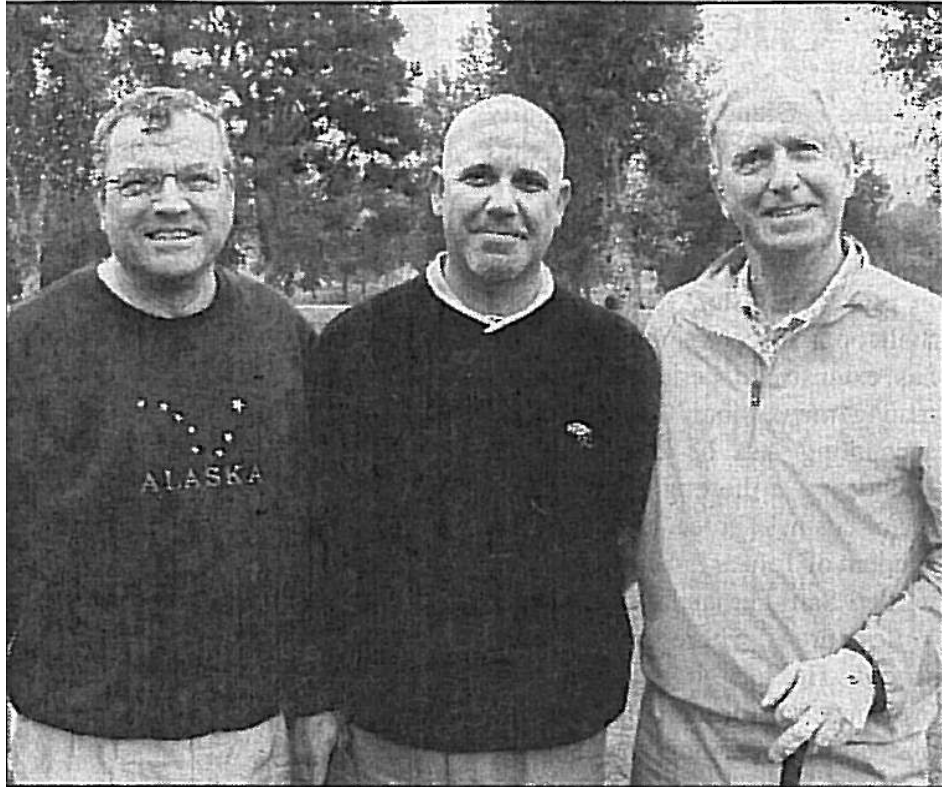
The West Tower is a 190,000 square-foot, seven-story building featuring 60 new patient beds, larger patient rooms, a family-centered Intensive Care Unit, a new emergency department, state-of-the-art technology and much more.

The golf tournament, featuring two flights and 160 golfers, included a putting competition, hole-in-one contests, closest-to-the-pin, straightest drive, longest drive and inside the circle contest.
